

ome to the Cabaret

"Engine, Engine #9" may begin the show, and be delivered with a suprisingly slow interlude.

"Foggy Mountain Breakdown" may follow that, and it'll be dished up in the best and most rousing bluegrass style.

solidly planted, digging deep with bold roots into firm musical sounds. Their wit is also frequently deep. certainly sharp.

I've seen cabarets rousing-with Paul Revere at Harrah's and Montana and Gary and Sandy at the

Then get ready for some gospel singing, and none of that fancy bow-tie and glitter vest gospel either:

old-fashioned go-to-meeting kind of gospel. Like cowboy music? I mean old-style around-thecampfire cowboy music? Well, there'll be a little of that, too-like the Sons of the Pioneers' "Tumbling Tumbleweeds."

Billy Joel? OK, we'll toss some of him in as well. only we'll do him with pedal steel accenting and definite twang

Some Carter Family? Some Willie Nelson? How about a Willie Nelson lookalike? Some Larry Gatlin?

In short, how about a rather ecletic mix of musical styles, but all done basically country-blues-bluegrass-swing?

The show, this week, then, is the Wright Brothers at the Sparks Nugget cabaret. The Wrights do just about every style of country music there is, and mix every style in with every other style. They do not as some groups do, however, blast with rock overtones

There are two groups who play the Nugget who do this style of music and have large followings-Montana and the Wright Brothers. The Wrights are less frantic than Montana, but certainly no less professional or skilled with a variety of musical instruments. The Wrights do not leap about; they remain pretty Nugget-but never more so than with the Wright Brothers. When these guys-Tom and Tim Wright and Carl Hinkle and Bernie Anderson-begin to twang and plunk and bang away, excitement jolts vou

Alternating with the Wright Brothers this week is a group called Tennyson. Theirs is a show nobody will dislike, just one nobody is likely to remember very long. There is some lovely stuff, like delicate flute backing of a few numbers; but little of much import that sets them apart from the herd of groups that offer generous samplings of current hits and pleasant patter.

Every tune is introduced with the name of the artist who made it big; few are done uniquely; all are done smoothly. Applause is polite, and Tennyson does its job well.

This is not to belittle the group. The backbones of Nevada lounges are groups just like Tennyson. They present themselves well, dish up what the customers want (contempo sounds and mild humor), put out pleasing personalities, and perform a well-paced show. They have no hit records to call their own: they travel extensively and work very hard, entertaining plenty of people

Visit the Nugget cabaret this week for good sounds all around
